Art Class Descriptions?

Keys to Landscape Painting

Every Tuesday, 5:30-8:30pm.

Instructor: Jeff Fennel:

This is a studio course focused on the fundamentals of painting the landscape. Painting from projected slides students will learn to see, simplify and compose the landscape to create a strong expressive statement. Students will study and develop fundamental skills including composition, value, color theory, edges, texture and framing. Traditional and contemporary landscape painters will be studied.

The price of each of the art courses: Student=\$100/month or \$250/3 months. Adults=\$125/month or \$300/3 months.

Keys to Drawing

Every Thursday, 5:30-8:30pm.

Instructor: Jeff Fennel:

Drawing is the foundation for Visual Art and Design. This course will focus on the fundamentals of good drawing skills. Drawing from simple Still Life setups students will learn how to use “sight measuring” to establish strong composition and accurately render shape, value and form. Home work and class critique will be an important part of this course. Students will be able to set up and light their own Still Life, develop a strong composition and accurately render the subject with proper perspective in a full range of values.

The price of each of the art courses: Student=\$100/month or \$250/3 months. Adults=\$125/month or \$300/3 months.

Beginning Stained Glass \$115

Instructor: Ray McElwain

The student will learn copper foil method of stained glass. This method was developed by Lewis Comfort Tiffany in the late 1800's. The student will learn be taught the needed skills and safety to create stained glass. Glass is cut to the pattern and each piece is wrapped with a boarder of copper foil. Pieces are then placed back on the pattern and soldered together. Tools and supplies must be ordered in advance. Pre ordered tools and tool kits available at first class. Fiber Art Class descriptions

Basic Crochet \$20.00 Includes crochet hook and cotton yarn.

Instructor: Patty Tompkins

Have you been yearning to crochet? Come and take this class to learn the basics. You will learn how to hold your hook and work basic crochet stitches (chain, single, double and triple crochet) while making a dish cloth. Class limited to 6.

Crochet Pattern Reading \$20.00

Instructor: Patty Tompkins

Learn to read patterns and create the various crochet stitches.

Crochet a Hat \$20.00

Instructor: Patty Tompkins

Students will learn to make a hat by crocheting in the round. Intermediate skills needed. Class limited to 6. (List of supplies needed will be available.)

Crochet Slippers (three meetings required)

The Student will learn to read a pattern as they crochet slippers for felting. Then they will learn to felt the slippers and to needle felt embellishments for the slippers. Student will need hooks sized H to M to set gauge. Yarn is available. This is an Intermediate class.

Crocheted Baby Blanket and Matching Hat \$35.00

Instructor: Patty Tompkins

Student will start a blanket learning the appropriate size and finish it at home. A matching hat will be finished in the class. This is an intermediate class skill level. Student will need to purchase yarn and hook.

Class limited to 5.

Felting

Felting is a process that binds loose protein fibers into a strong, durable and shapeable material. This skill may be used to embellish your fashions, create dimensional art, or add texture to fabric.

Beginning Needle Felting \$20.00

Instructor: Sandi Ridge

Learn to shape and sculpt fiber into useable or decorative objects. Needle felting requires just one lesson and the ways to use this skill are limitless. All needed materials are supplied by the instructor.

Wet Felt Classes

Our wet felting classes include hat felting and fine felting on silk. Learn to create and shape natural fibers into a strong, useable material. Felt created with the wet felting process makes gorgeous designer fabric, hats, shoes, purses, blankets, wall hanging, material for home décor or fashion and other items that only your imagination can create.

Fine Felting on Silk

This process is also called Nuno Felt. "Nuno" comes from the Japanese word for "tissue". Making Nuno felt, (very fine) silk or other transparent fabrics are felted together with the protein fibers. Because the fibers shrink in the felting process, while merging with the other materials, it causes extraordinary changes to occur in the structures. Nuno felt becomes a beautiful, fine, supple, sensuous yet strong fabric. Learn the techniques necessary to felt fine fibers and embellishments to silk. This process creates a finished drape-able fabric that has many uses for fashion and home décor. The student will complete a scarf during this class. All materials included.

Painting on Silk

Instructor: Vicki Alwardt

The student will learn to free form paint on silk. For this class the student will paint a simple design on a white silk scarf. Type of paint and finishing techniques will be discussed. Paint, forms and brushes will be provided for use during this class.

Basic Embroidery \$20.00

Class includes thread, needle and cloth. You will have the use of a hoop, or bring your own.

Instructor: Patty Tompkins

The class will cover basic embroidery stitches and will have a nice sampler when you finish. Class limited to 6.

Locker Hooking \$20

Instructor: Judy Murphy

Using loops of loose fiber, rovings or strips pulled from bats of fiber with a "Locker Hook" the crafter pulls the fiber through squares on a piece of rug canvas. *Locker hooking* is a method appropriate for rugs, wall hangings, chair pads hats, handbags, and a host of other items. Beginning supplies are available.

Beginning Knitting \$75.00

Instructor: Trinna Higgs

The student will learn: cast on, knit, purl, ribbing, bind off, increase, decrease, yarn over, pattern stitches, charts, written directions and more. Begin your knitting experience on the right foot. This is also a refresher course for those that used to knit. Supplies are included. (8 hours of instruction over 4 evenings)

Orenberg Lace Knitting \$85

Student will complete a fine Orenberg/Russian lace alpaca scarf using yarn that was spun to the instructor's specifications. Book and yarn are included. Skills needed are the ability to cast on, knit and bind off. (Six hours of instruction, 3 meeting over 6 weeks)

Beginning Spinning \$75.00 Instructor: Patty Tompkins

The student will learn the basics of spinning and wheel care. The student will experience spinning many fibers including alpaca, wools, and cotton. We will talk about what to look for when purchasing a wheel and take a look at helpful books. This is a three meeting class. This class includes fiber and use of a wheel.

Class is limited to 6.

Beginning Tatting \$50 Instructor Norma Grove

Tatting is a dying art form used to make a form of lace. It is created by using a shuttle to tie knots in intricate patterns. All supplies included in this class. Tatting is used mostly for embellishing. It is a fascinating skill to learn and it is the transportable form of fiber art.

Weaving I \$95.00 Instructor: Patty Tompkins

This beginning class starts each student on a pre-warped loom with yarn of your choosing. You become familiar with the different parts of the loom and how it works. You will finish a scarf by the

end of the day. The student will make yarn selection prior to class, yarn purchase is separate.
Class limited to 5.

Weaving II \$100.00 + cost of yarn.

Instructor: Patty Tompkins

Students will learn to plan and measure warp, warp the loom and weave a scarf, finishing it on the second day if need be. The student make yarn selection prior to class, yarn purchase is separate.
